AN EXCURSION TRIP TO BENGALURU AND MYSORE

31st December, 2018 to 05th January, 2019

In man-made wonder, you would find cities that represent the rich cultural heritage of the bygone era and cities that are high-tech and modern. If you are keen to have a combination of these both, I assure, you can find it on your visit to Bengaluru, the erstwhile Bangalore. The city's friendly climatic conditions made our stay pleasant and enjoyable. We forgot the hectic journey from Champa to Bengaluru. After boarding in hotel, we were ready to visit ISKCON Radha-Krishna Temple. One of the largest ISKCON temple in the world, ISKCON Bengaluru is a must visit to experience religious fervor and architectural beauty. The temple organizes many activities for Krishna devotees; these include youth programs, cultural programs, and many festivals. The temple has six separate shrines and a 17m gold-plated flag; a 9m gold-plated Kalash Shikara. On returning, it was party time, being 31st December. We dressed and assembled in the hall to

welcome the new-year. It was a grand party and we enjoyed a lot. Next day we had a list of places to visit. If we are talking about The Garden City then it is impossible to skip the huge lung spaces like Cubbon Park spread across 100 acres of area with various species of plants and trees. Lalbag! Have you been to the flower show? It houses India's largest collection of tropical plants. Bennerghatta National Park is one of the biggest tourist attraction in Bengaluru. No matter where you live, you will always be close to nature. Now we moved from nature to Palace. Located in the most crowded market area, Tipu Sultan Fort represents the artistic talent that prevailed in the past. Tipu Sultan who completed it during 1791 and it served as his summer retreat. The two-storied structure has pillars, carved arches and balconies. It represents Islamic style and you could find a temple of Ganesh, a Hindu God. This throws light on the religious tolerance exhibited by the



ruler. If you love to go deep into historical facts, you need to visit the art gallery in the fort, which houses historical paintings, photos and carvings. Next we headed towards VITM. Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum, Bengaluru, was established in memory of Bharat Ratna Sir M. Visvesvaraya. VITM has striven to fulfill its objectives of stimulating interest in science education among children and adults alike and to encourage them to pursue career in pure science. Examples of many young talents guided at VITM, who have reached new heights in their career in the field of Science and Technology, are legion. On third day we went to U R Rao Satellite Centre (URSC), Bengaluru, formerly known as ISRO Satellite Centre (ISAC) is the

lead centre for building satellite and developing associated satellite technologies. These space crafts are used for providing application to various users in the area of Communication, Navigation, Metrology, Remote Sensing, Space Science and interplanetary explorations. The Centre is also pursuing advanced technologies for future missions. On fourth day once again we turned towards nature, The Brindavan Gardens, located in the Mandya district of Karnataka, is the abode of nature, built across the notable river of India, Cauvery. The endless lush green terrace garden and prolific plants that are present in abundance all around give a soul-soothing site. Spread over an area of 60 acres, Brindavan Garden made us feel over whelmed right from the

entrance with its charming rose gardens and flower beds. Constructed in 1932 by the Diwan of Mysore, Sir Mira Ismail, Brindavan Garden is visited by millions of tourists every year. On fifth day we visited Mysore Palace. An incredibly breathtaking example of Indo-Saraanic style of architecture, the Mysore Palace is a magnificent edifice located in Mysore. Also known as the Amba Vilas Palace, it is the former palace of the royal family of Mysore and is still their official residence. Referred to as the 'City of Palaces', Mysore houses seven other palaces. Mysore Palace was built in the year 1912 for the 24th Ruler of the Wodeyar Dynasty and is counted amongst one of the biggest palaces in the country.
